Rodney Weber, Beacon Developer: Is concerned about the impact this change will have on those developers who have received project approvals from the planning board and have based their financing on those approvals. Believes those developers should be grandfathered in. He would like to better define workforce housing and suggests that the law should be given more thought. HE gave a few suggestions for working with developers who are at a particular stage in their projects who will be greatly affected.

Council Member Reports:

- 9. Ali Muhammad: Good evening. Volunteered last year with the Youth Police Academy. Thanked the DPW for always doing such a great job in keeping the city clean and removing debris after bad storms. Has been receiving complains about the noise from Newburgh. Residents have asked him if the City of Beacon could sue the Newburgh waterfront owners for noise pollution. Anthony Ruggiero added that he has reached out to Newburgh and to the Congressman's office regarding the matter. He will keep council apprised of the developments.
- **10. Omar Harper:** Thinks that the Police Youth Academy is a great representation of relations here in Beacon. Thanked Anthony and Zep for taking care of something for constituents.
- **11.** Lee Kyriacou: Thank everyone for coming.
- 12. George Mansfield: Nothing to add.
- **13. Pam Wetherbee**: Gave details about National Night out. Would like an update on the highway garage. Anthony advised that he will give that update on Aug. 22. Was happy to be able to put out her weekly

recycling this week. A constituent on Delevan who wanted to know if we could add a speed bump to slow people down on the hill. Also concerned about the traffic when the Highland Hospital Project is complete. There will be a blood drive on Monday, Aug. 8 at Beacon Hebrew Alliance. Would like to know more about the afterschool programs. With regard to the noise from Newburgh, has anyone reached out to the Liquor Commission? Reminded that the IRS scam is still occurring. People should not give out any information to them.

- 14. Peggy Ross: Has heard from a constituent that the Newburgh noise is intermittent.
- 15. A discussion with all members regarding the noise coming from the Newburgh waterfront took place. Councilman Kyriacou advised that the conditions of the River affect how the noise is carried. The Mayor recommended creating a record of instances where the noise is a nuisance. He thinks we need to have our police measure the level of noise. The mayor advised that he has been trying to communicate this problem to Newburgh for 4 years. Nick Ward Willis advised that residents should call the police when they deem the noise too loud.
